Dr Tanya S. Harris | Medical Director ABI Rehab

Hailing from the US, Dr. Tanya S. Harris received her medical diploma from Philadelphia's Temple University School of Medicine in 2002.

She went on to graduate at the top of her residency at the University of Kentucky before starting her own rehabilitation practice.

Drawn to neurorehabilitation, she went on to earn subspecialty board certifications in Brain Injury Medicine and Electrodiagnostic Medicine.



Dr Suzie Mudge | Director & Physiotherapist

Suzie is a physiotherapist who splits her time between her Neuro Rehab Results and AUT University.

She contributes a 'clinical-reality' perspective to the person centred research team and is particularly interested in what helps clinicians change their behaviour to improve their practice.

Equally challenging is the flipside of the role of trying to improve her own clinical practice by embedding research findings. She sees these two roles as complementary and always challenging.

Alison Coyle | Occupational Therapist & Reg. Hand Therapist BSc (Occupational Therapy), PGD (Acu), MHPrac

Alison graduated from the University of Cape Town (UCT) in 1993 with a Degree in Occupational Therapy.

She was then based in New York and London from 1994-1997, working in paediatrics and hand therapy. Choosing to emigrate to NZ in 1998, Alison took a role as Section Head of burns, plastics and hand therapy at Middlemore Hospital, helping plan and develop the growing services there.

Alison then moved in to private practice, working and co-partnering a clinic with a hand therapy and vocational rehabilitation focus. Alison has been with Hands On Rehabilitation since 2004.
